THE BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE OF THE PROJECT

With its several COVID19 relief initiatives across India, the Muthoot Group takes the lead in the provision of Disaster Management amenities to the needy. Strict lockdown is a key part of the multi-pronged strategy used by the Indian Government to counter the COVID19's impact on the nation. The lockdown situation, however, might have left some sections in the society isolated with worries about running out of food and other supplies. With a distinguished family business tradition and a solid reputation in the Indian financial sector. With a distinguished family business tradition and a solid reputation in the Indian financial sector, Muthoot Finance has operations all over the country. A variety of ration packs that might let these families survive for weeks have been distributed by the company to some of the poorest and most in needy groups in society, including migrant workers, daily wage employees, and many more. The Company has so far distributed over 40,000 ration kits comprising of 5-7 Kgs. of rice, wheat flour, pulses, cooking oil, salt, sugar & spices and some hygiene items like soaps and detergents. Besides the Group has also fed over 46,000 people with ready to eat cooked food, distributed over 50,000 face masks, 10,000 pairs of hand gloves, 10,000 bottles of hand sanitizers besides other relief work. The Group has partners with more than 2 dozen reputed NGOs and Charity organizations, local state police such as Mumbai Police, Delhi Police, Assam Police, Jharkhand Police, West Bengal Police to name a few. The Group has also joined hands with BMC in Mumbai, Sri Sri Ravi Shankar Ji's organization, India Food Banking Network, Help Age India and Rasoi on Wheels to name a few. The Group's over 70 Regional Offices & 5000+ branches across India have been leading ground level humanitarian work to do their best so that relief reaches to the most remote parts of the country. Recently the Group also partnered with ASSOCHAM to feed over 1000 healthcare professionals and corona warriors every day at Safdarjung Hospital over a 5-day period. The Group has also supplied over 1000 face shields to police officials across a few other

states.Most intriguingly, encouraged by the Group Management, a greater number of members of the 40,000+ member Muthoot Group family are working diligently to help the less fortunate and are devotedly carrying out this relief activity.

Project head -Supporting other organizations to improve the infrastructure facilities of the organization

Sector in which the project is covered - Improving quality of life

THE BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE OF THE PROJECT

During the time of Covid 19, people were suffering with health issues and economical issues. Government was in need of more health equipments and health support machinery. The project was aimed to support various agencies to purchase medical equipments, transportation facilities especially ambulance, palliative care facility development in various health institutions, palliative care room facilities, and haematology analyzer, medical equipments for different hospitals in different states etc were the request from various other agencies during covid situation. Other organizations were economically struggling to improve the infrastructure facilities of the organization. Understanding the situation and needs the funding agency has decided to act upon the request.

DETAILS OF THE PROJECT

When COVID was at its worst, the Kerala government issued an order requiring hospitals to reserve 50% of their beds for COVID patients. Cases of COVID were rising daily. The hospital's intensive care facilities needed to be upgraded. A team of doctors from the district collector's office examined the hospital facilities and recommended that more COVID ICU beds be installed because of the rising demand. In this crucial situation the CSR funding committee decided to provide CSR fund in health sector to supporting other organizations to improve the infrastructure facilities of the organization. The main aim was to improve the quality of life through these activities. The funding also provided in the banner of Karunyasparsham too. CT Scan Machine for Hospitals in Kozhencherry and Pathanamthitta A Project to provide free advanced 128 Slice CT Scan Services to the poor, needy and marginalized patients for early diagnosis without time delay at Kozhencherry. Most of the people in the area are agriculturists and daily wagers. They, use the services of MMC, Kozhencherry and its diagnostic facilities for their health needs. Although large number of patents with complex medical issues have been treated here at MMC, they are unable to provide diagnostic needs like CT Pulmonary Angiogram, CT Brain angiogram, Triple phase CT Etc. with the current facilities and they are forced to refer the patients to far away centres,

the cost of which are not affordable for many. As such there is an urgent need to upgrade the scan facility to 128 slice CT machine. This upgrade will definitely be crucial in providing subsidized CT services to all eligible and marginalized poor patients.

A detailed study conducted by MMC indicate the number of cases in the first year, 2nd year and 3rdyear will be 4250,4560 and 4632respectively. As per the present plan 50% of these patients will be treated free (Value of free services will be 2200 cases@ Rs.4000 = 88 lakhs). This will be a big support to needy patients for early diagnosis and continuing necessary treatment without any delay. As shown above this project will of great benefit to the people, especially the poor and deprived of Kozhencherry. Project "KarunyaSparsham" –is a project to provide free advanced 128 Slice CT Scan Services to the poor, needy and marginalized patients for early diagnosis without time delay at MMC, Pathanamthitta.

As per official statistics 36% of the population of Pathanamthitta district is near poverty line aggravated by this current COVID19 pandemic. Most of the people in the district are agriculturists and daily wagers. They, especially people from eastern part of the district use the services of MMC and its diagnostic facilities. MMC, Pathanamthitta is an NABH Entry Level Certified hospital. This is the first hospital in Pathanamthitta, 8th in Kerala and 15th in India to get a certification from NABH Safe-1. Although large number of patents with complex medical issues have been treated here at MMC, they are unable to provide diagnostic needs like CT Pulmonary Angiogram, CT Brain angiogram, Triple phase CT Etc. with the current facilities and they are forced to refer the patients to far away centers, the cost of which are not affordable for many. As such there is an urgent need to upgrade the scan facility to 128 slice CT machine. This upgrade will definitely be crucial in providing subsidized CT services to all eligible and marginalized poor patients.

A detailed study conducted by MMC indicate the number of cases in the first year, 2nd year and 3rd year will be 4250,4560 and 4632respectively. Under the "KarunyaSparsham" plan 50% of these patients will be treated free (Value of free services will be 2200 cases@ Rs.4000 = 88 lakhs). The Trust established a school in the 2016–17 academic years called Sanskara School, which offers education from kindergarten through the seventh grade (at the time) in the CBSE Stream. In the upcoming years, it will gradually be expanded up to 12" Class.

The Muthoot Group and the Kerala government worked together to create the Sanskara School. The Kerala Government has given The Muthoot Educational Trust the task of creating a best educational institution as part of the development plan for Info park II after conducting a rigorous technical study. As a result, M/s. Info park Kerala has agreed to lease 5.25 acres of land for this school, which is located within Infopark, to MET for a duration of 90 years.

The project is mainly aimed at the promotion of Sports and Games to prepare a healthy young generation as a part of Government of India's "Khelo India Scheme', and built Sports Complex at Sanskara School located phase II infopark, Kakkanad. Through the completion of the sports complex, the students of Sanskara School and the public citizens were able to develop their different skills in the sports area.

The project focuses on the skill development in both sports and athletics. The project includes facilities like skating rink, swimming pool, games like Table Tennis, Badminton, squash court, Chess & Caroms. The outdoor sports facilities include a standard size athletic track, football ground, cricket ground, volleyball and basketball courts. Winning games is not the only aspect of sports. Another crucial component is creating communities that are stronger, healthier, and happier. Strong social relationships are also formed in communities where sports are allowed. The assessment was done by a team of 7 members of social impact assessment from De Paul Extension Service, Angamaly. Different methods have been used to find out the impact of the sports complex and to evaluate the effectiveness of the project.

The primary method used for the assessment was observation method. From the observation of the team members we have found that the sports complex had brought a positive impact on the individual's skill development in the field of sports and athletics. The sports complex has adequate lighting setup and players have the freedom to start games at any time. People can find the tools they need at sports complexes to stay active all year round. Of course, indoor sports facilities let you play in rain or shine, but even outdoor ones offer players court lines, netting, and flat areas for competition. Players may be shielded from weather conditions including UV rays, strong winds, and rain depending on the configuration. Some outdoor facilities are situated in an area that receives shade, thus extreme heat is not an issue. Both the body and the mind benefited greatly from the sports complex. The sports complex has s brought a positive change in the society. From the observation of our team members we recognized that every community need a sports complex like this.

The second tool used for the assessment was unstructured interview method. In this the team membersdon't ask standardized questions of each interviewee. Instead we have used unstructured open-ended questions which are questions that encourage a longer answer than a simple "yes" or "no". Team members communicated with around 60 members of the locality which include children, adolescents and the elderly about the sports complex. All their comments about the sports complex was in a positive way. The responses of the locality members were like, the sports complex became the primary recreation centre of the locality, the members of the locality were able to experience a world class sports experience through this sports complex.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The school has utilized Rs.70,78,759/- from the CSR fund of Muthoot Finance Limited. Additionally, a committee has given the go-ahead for numerous school-based sports promotion initiatives.
